Each week we will talk about these issues from a different perspective: Faith in a Changing Church; Pope Francis – a disturbing Pope sent by God: Finding God in ordinary life; and the Future of the Church and the Church of the Future. Richard Shields, who teaches theology at the University of St. Michael’s College and is a St. Augustine’s parishioner, will facilitate each session.
