MENTAL WELLNESS MOMENT: Coping with the Holiday Season

Are you feeling stressed, sad, anxious, or worried? Moreso than usual, perhaps? Feeling somehow inadequate to meet all the demands you have from others or put upon yourself? Are you having trouble saying "no" to requests from others at this holiday time of year? You are not alone in this. How many times have you seen articles or heard speakers on TV/radio/podcasts or streaming services talking about how to cope with the holiday season? If it were just you, there would not be all these resources on this topic talking about the same way you are feeling/thinking.

The secular world has defined this as a time of scarcity – not enough of everything. This drives us to feel anxious, to strive harder, to feel inadequate. This becomes intensified at this time of year.

The first step towards ease is recognizing that we are stressed that our inner critic has taken on additional intensity, demanding that we be perfect or we are proving we are not good enough. Recalling the spiritual meaning of this time of year can give some ease. Realizing that it is OK to feel sad or down or anxious at this time of year is a step towards feeling some ease. We are not alone. Might we take a pause for just a moment; take a deep breath, notice the struggle, the tension and release it - just for the moment. Might we remember the important part of this season, without guilt-tripping ourselves in any way. Perhaps taking the moment to reflect on the "reason for the season". The central core of our faith encounters the secular world's notion of scarcity. Christ was born to bring joy and peace to the world; to all of humanity. His birth reminds us of God's infinite love. Armed with his love we can share it with family, friends and neighbours throughout the holiday season; not just coping, feeling the precious gift of moments of joy.

Might we listen to our favourite seasonal song or carol; reflect on an Advent reading or prayer; speak with a close friend or family member who is truly supportive of us, or perhaps speak to someone in the parish at Mass or at Hospitality Sunday coffee hour? Perhaps we could come back to our breath, to noticing the things around us that bring us a moment of joy and rest in that. Might we offer gratitude for those blessings in that moment? Offering ourselves the compassion we need in that moment, soothing and caring for ourselves, allow us to continue on with perhaps more energy, a smile on our face, and feeling more connected to others. May we be blessed with many moments of pause, many moments of seeing small blessings in our travels and may we feel the joy of the birth of our saviour.
