In June we celebrate the Sacred Heart of Jesus, whose love and care taught us how to live and love in our lives. As summer approaches take some time to relax into the season with purpose. Show how to love by your interactions and activities: pray together daily, attend Mass even when you are away, read together, take time for hiking, have a family games nights, spend time preparing and cooking as a family, etc. Teaching how to love with the heart of Jesus happens through interaction and will help create loving, confident, healthy children.



MENTAL WELLNESS MOMENT

June is the month to celebrate Father's Day; celebrating Father's and Father-like folks in our lives. Might we give some thought to the Blessed St. Joseph – earthly father to Jesus? It is also the month to deeply consider the meaning to us of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

As is the case with us humans, rarely are relationships perfect. Might we be grateful for our Fathers and Father-like figures for their intended caring for us even in the smallest of ways. Might we give to ourselves the caring that we need are missing in our lives.

Jesus experienced the full range of human emotions and did not hide his heart but rather displayed it in a miraculous event for us. Might we learn about the gift of vulnerability and the connection it can bring us with others.

A recent example of this was the March presentation by Karen and Katie Kiely of their journey – and the resulting connection of community for all who attended, for those who reached out to them after the talk; for those who spoke to their neighbours in the room afterwards – the connection, fostering of genuine caring occurring from the vulnerability. Such a blessing. Might we explore this at the next Sign of Peace in Mass; next coffee hour after Mass or meeting that we attend; next chat with a friend, a neighbour, stranger – leaning in just the amount of sharing that feels comfortable in that moment? Might we look for the silver linings in difficult situations even the smallest silver linings; might we take courage from Jesus's example and share ourselves even a tiny bit with our faith community?

Perhaps it could be helpful this month, to pray the Our Father daily in a heartfelt way while considering the words/meaning to us. "Thy kingdom come" invites the Father into our lives, in the here and now. Might this help us look for this blessing as we journey.
